



Code of Ethics

All games and practices shall be governed by AYSO Rules & Regulations. If during game play the conduct of a player goes beyond the limits of good sportsmanship and fair play the referee will caution (yellow card) or eject (red card) the offending person(s). Issuance of a yellow card will require the player to leave the field for a cooling off period. Two yellow cards in the same game equal a red card. Ejection from a game mandates suspension from the next game.

The referee will file the necessary reports prior to leaving the field. If spectator or coach conduct goes beyond the limits of good sports-manship, this may result in the offender being asked to leave the field or if necessary, termination of the game. Please refrain from such conduct and set a good example for the children.

Coaches will be responsible for proper behavior of parents and players assigned to their team. In the event that a child is injured during the course of a game, the referee will stop play. If there is further danger to the injured player, Or at the first available opportunity, a coach will be called onto the field to attend to the child. Parents/spectators are not to enter the field unless called by the referee.

The goals, nets and other field equipment have been purchased by Region 345 for use by the players. Goals and nets are not to be used as monkey bars by any child. Parents will be held financially responsible for damage caused by inappropriate behavior of their children.

- No pets are allowed on the field.
- Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on the field.
- Please help us maintain our fields. All fields must be left in clean condition after each game.
- Parents can help by reminding children not to litter.
- Coaches will remain ten yards on either side of the halfway line in the coaches box on the side of the field that the team is on. Only 1 coach and 1 assistant coach from each team may be in the box.
- Parents and spectators must remain at least 12 feet behind the sideline. No one is allowed behind the end zones.
- Negative or inflammatory remarks or actions directed toward coaches, players, referees, AYSO staff and other spectators are absolutely unacceptable and will not be tolerated from anyone. Remember, everyone is a volunteer!
- The referee during a game makes the final decision in all matters.
- Individuals wishing to discuss any aspect of the program should do so in a positive manner by first speaking with the coach, then the division director. If your questions cannot be answered or resolved, then call a member of the Executive Board.
