- * AYSO abides by the 6 Philosophies- They are the core of our program and what separates AYSO from other sport organizations.
 - 1. Everyone Plays-What does that mean?

Our program's goal is for kids to play soccer. It's no fun to spend the game on the bench...and that's no way to learn soccer! No player sits on the bench twice until all players have sat once.

2. Balanced Teams-Teams are balanced. What does that mean?

Each year we form new teams as evenly balanced as possible because it's more fun and a better learning experience when teams of similar ability play. It allows each player to gain the experience of a wide variety of teammates of different skill levels

3. Open Registration-What does that mean?

Our program is open to all children between 4 and 19 years of age who want to register and play soccer. Interest and enthusiasm are the only criteria for playing. There are no elimination try-outs, and nobody gets cut.

4. Positive Coaching-What does that mean?

Encouragement of player effort provides for greater enjoyment for the players and leads to better-skilled and better-motivated players. A coach can be one of the most influential people in a child's life, so AYSO requires they create a positive experience for every boy and girl.

5. Good Sportsmanship-This is a key philosophy for Players, Parents and spectators!

We strive to create a positive environment based on mutual respect rather than a win-at-all-costs attitude, and our program is designed to instill good sportsmanship in every facet of AYSO.

We keep no standings here.

There is no championship, just the opportunity to play soccer and have fun.

6. Player Development- What does that mean?

We believe that all players should be able to develop their soccer skills and knowledge to the best of their abilities, both individually and as members of a team, to maximize their enjoyment of the game.

* Florida Weather

The weather can change at any moment so PLEASE **DO NOT drop your children off!!** There is a lightening detector in Okeeheelee so when it sounds or if we see lightening first, we will sound an air horn. All fields must be immediately cleared including bleachers (which are metal a big **NO NO** for lightening)

- Sky must be lightening free for 20 minutes for an all clear to be given. If your child's game was at halftime or more, that game will not resume.
- If it was a 6U game at any point it will not resume due to shortness of game.
- We hate bad weather just as much as you but sometimes Park closure is beyond our control. The County may close due to field conditions.

* Injuries

- Another reason NOT TO DROP OFF your child. Anything can happen at any time!!
- We need an adult there who can decide for the child. We care about our players!
- Each player that has a Social Security (AYSO Nationals rule not ours) Is eligible for our insurance coverage.

It can be supplemental to yours or the primary if you have none. There is a \$1,000.00 deductible.

Be sure your coach or team manager fills out an accident report for any injury. If the child needed medical attention come to the office to get the needed forms and instruction. AYSO insurance pays after the fact so you will need copies of all bills to submit.

Many of the children are not properly hydrated for training or games!! We cannot stress enough WATER, WATER all season. The water they drink today doesn't help today. **Always Bring** a drink to every training and practice!!!!

- * A few rules to follow;
 - 1. No smoking anywhere in the field area. Smoking is allowed in parking lot.
 - 2. No Pets! It's not that we don't love them, it's just we don't love what they leave behind.
 - 3. No bad language in ANY language at any time! This is a Kid Zone!
 - 4. No alcohol anywhere at any time in the Park.
- * **GAMES** are on Saturday's starting September 7 and ending November 16, 2024. **GAMES** are held between 8:00 am and 7:00 pm and are held at Okeeheelee Park
- * PRACTICES are MONDAY & WEDNESDAY or TUESDAY & THURSDAY

<u>Field Designations</u>-Fields are designated Field 10 (field to the west by the water, Field 11, Field 12, Field 13 (field to the east by road), Field 14 is by the golf course. Fields are designate to NW is A, NE is B, C is NW next to A, D is NE next to B, E is SW next to C, F is SW next to D, G is SW next to E, H is NW next to F

- * All children will receive a uniform consisting of a game shirt, short, and socks. They will also receive a practice shirt with their sponsor's name on it (if their team has a sponsor). - * All children will receive a medal or trophy at the end of the season, a subscription to PLAYSOSOCCER Magazine, and accident insurance.
- * Equipment needed for practices & games Shinguards, water bottle, soccer cleats, and ball to practice with. Balls are sized accordingly: Size 3 for 5- to 8-year-olds (6U's & 8U's), Size 4 for 9- to 12-year-olds (10U's & 12U's), & Size 5 for 13 and older (14U's & 19U's)
